Curriculum

Senior Secondary Year 11-12

Queensland teachers have implemented the 2019 senior syllabuses, which represented a significant change for teachers and students due to the introduction of a subject specific external assessment. A <u>subject report</u> is produced for Economics, which supports teaching, learning and assessment. The suggestion from QCAA is to read the IA1 section when you are creating assessments and when marking, then IA2 when appropriate and so on.

Do not forget resources on the QCAA portal for *Using ISMGs* and *Making judgments*. These focus on analysing and evaluating criteria and are very useful to view before you mark and especially if you are new to Economics.

A draft refined syllabus for all subjects, including Economics, will be released in Term 2. QETA will be seeking feedback from teachers in a survey to ensure all teachers are involved in the revision. The Syllabus Revision project will be led by a small group within the Management Committee to avoid any conflict-of-interest issues.
